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Regular Meeting of the City Council was held remotely on Monday evening, February 16, 2021.

**CALL TO ORDER**

Council President Kazinskas called the meeting to order at 7:30 o'clock p.m.

Councillor Judy Mack was absent.

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PUBLIC HEARINGS**#10394**

President Elizabeth Kazinskas opened the Public Hearing on the Petition by National Grid and Verizon New England, Inc. to install one (1) JO Pole on Manca Drive beginning at a point approximately 485 feet south of the centerline of the intersection of West Broadway and Manca Drive and continuing approximately 17 feet in an east direction. Installing one (1) JO Pole in the public way of Manca Drive for commercial service of 440 West Broadway.

The President announced that a representative of National Grid was not available for the hearing due to “storm-related duties.” She did read an email statement for the record from Vinny LoGuidice, a representative from National Grid, of what would have been said at tonight’s Public Hearing.

The President thrice called for persons wishing to testify in favor of the Petition.

There being none, the President thrice called for persons wishing to testify in opposition.

There being none, President Kazinskas closed the Hearing at 7:51 p.m.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYORORDERS**#10395**

Councillor Walsh informed the Council that this money order was previously on the calendar and later removed at the request by the Mayor to leave to withdraw for various reasons. It is now back on the calendar with new information.

Councillor Scott Graves stated that the city did not use the procurement statute to get bids. The reason why they have a procurement statute is so that the tax payers get the best price possible for the services that the city is obtaining. Since this will cost a lot, he would like to see that the city follow chapter 30B of Massachusetts General Law.

Councillor Karen Hardern mentioned some concerns she has about the property. She believes it is a health and safety issue and wanted to know if the city can cordon off the building in case it falls. If the building falls, it could be a catastrophe because on one side of the building there is a home, on the other, there is a business, and then you have the road.

Councillor James Boone mentioned that the area is a state highway.

Mayor Nicholson stated that he is fine with the item being referred back to the Finance Committee. He did reach out to DOT with Councillor Boone’s concern, they did let them

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know that it was a state owned road but maintained by the city. Also, Mass General Law does not allow the city to go through the formal bidding process until an appropriation has been made by the appropriation authority (the City Council). Until the appropriation is made they are not legally allowed to go through the formal procurement process. The bids were based on quotes received.

NEW BUSINESS

Councillor Boudreau stated that he wanted to share some information for the residents of Ward 3 regarding 177 West Street:

- This property has been a long standing issue and safety concerns that have increased
- If the building were to collapse it would fall onto Custom Auto Body building, the building next door or into the street
- Mayor Nicholson has reached out to the Mass Department of Environmental Protection to seek potential grant funding to assist with the possible chemical removal and demolition of this property
- He would like to thank Mayor Nicholson, Community Development and Planning Department, Building Department, and the Fire Department for their attention to this matter. He hopes it can be dealt with

Additionally, Councillor Boudreau mentioned that he would like to join two of his colleagues in stating something that he should have stated two weeks ago:

- He finds it ludicrous in nature that the City Solicitor would ask the City Council not speak on an issue that he personally has no privileged information on at all
- This is the second time this request was made to him. Once in 2017 and one this year
- In 2017 he brought a coil into the meeting and he was speaking about the issues a number of constituents in his ward were going through. Without any privileged information, without any information of lawsuits the he was aware of, he only had information portrayed to him by moving into Ward 3
- At that time, he didn't know his rights were as a City Councillor, so he stopped speaking about it. Every time someone would bring this issue up to him, he would tell the constituents that they can't talk about it, and file with the City Clerk's Office
- Looking back, he believes it was not right and inappropriate for him not to speak about this issue two weeks ago when Councillor Mack and Graves did. He commends them for bringing it up again.

Councillor Dernalowicz wanted to congratulate Judge Mark Goldstein for being appointed at the Gardner District Court as the first justice, a former attorney in town.

Councillor James Boone would like to thank Councillor Boudreau for bringing up his thoughts and opinions to the committee and public. Would like everyone to be safe out there with the first February storm going on.

Councillor Graves mentioned that Governor Baker signed a new law a few weeks ago that will change a lot of the zoning:

- It will change section 5, chapter 48.
- The purpose of it is to facilitate permitting and housing development in communities.

- One change will be for certain zoning changes regarding votes going from two-thirds to majority vote.
- He is looking forward to getting some guidance from the law department as to how these changes are going to affect this City Council and the other boards and commissions in the city.

Councillor Walsh mentioned the changes to the zoning enabling act, chapter 40A that was passed by the Governor recently. He inquired about this earlier in the day with the City Solicitor as well as the Planning Director and learned in response that the department of housing and urban development is preparing for municipalities a comprehensive survey and analysis. It will provide guidance to all the cities and town about the manner which we will be affected by the various provisions in the amendments. The directors indicated that they will share that information with the Council upon receipt.

Councillor Ronald Cormier stated that he noticed that the Mayor and his cohorts have been trying to keep the public informed regarding the vaccination for the COVID 19 and would like to thank him for the efforts they've made. It has been a confusing situation. The rollout has not exactly been smooth and many of the constituents need help and they are trying to provide that.

President Kazinskas would like to echo what Councillor Ronald Cormier said about vaccine information and the city's efforts to be sure that our residents are informed and notified about the day by day, sometimes hour by hour process. She understands that the rollout was challenging and frustration for a lot of people and she appreciates that the city is doing its part to keep the residents informed and offering assistance as well.

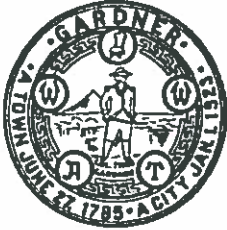

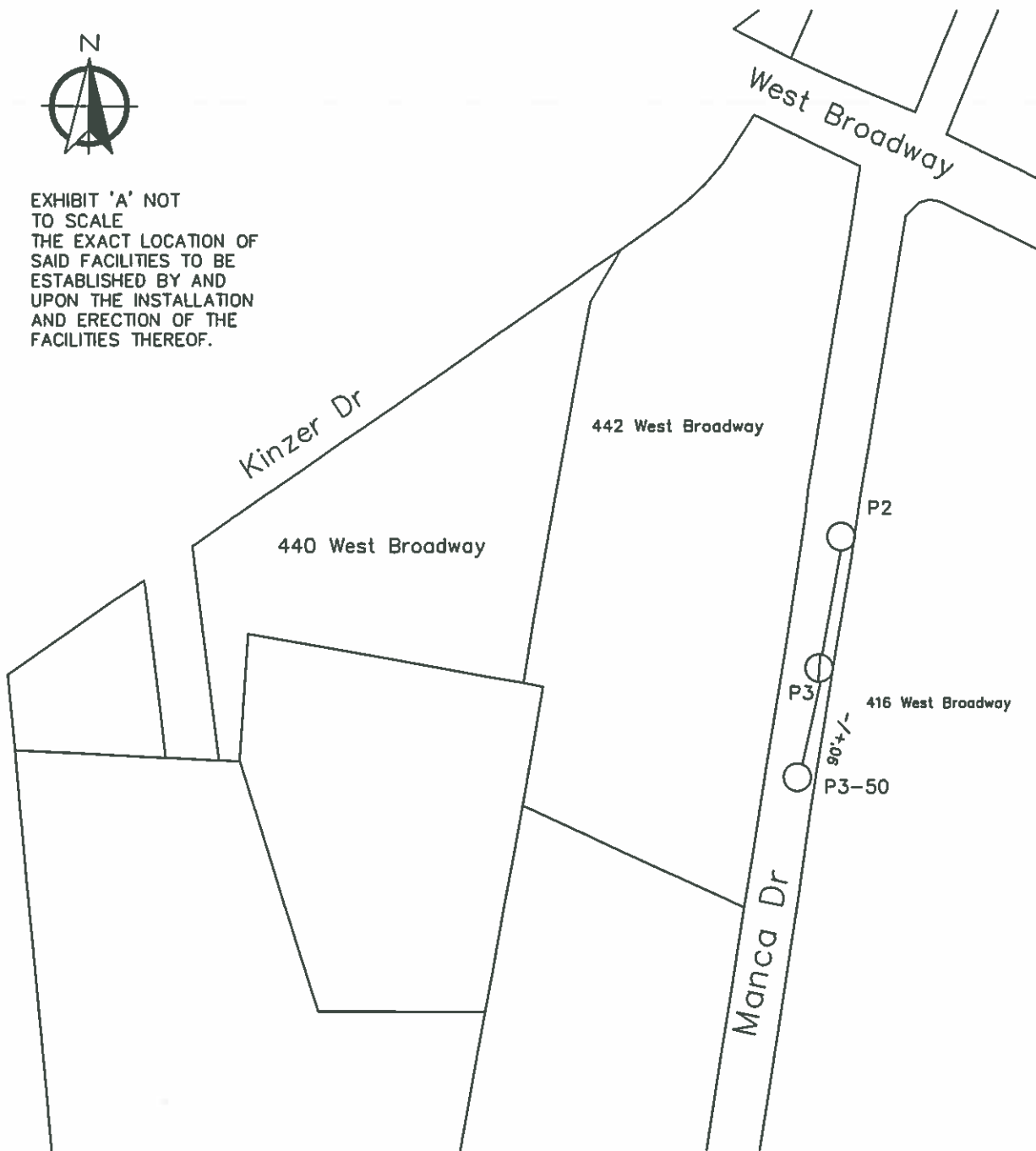

RE: Money Order- Demolition of 177 West Street

Dear President Kazinskas and Councilors,

On Thursday, February 11, myself along with Commissioner Jean, Director Beauregard, Attorney Flick, and Chief Lagoy met with representatives of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA").

Both agencies have informed us that they will not be providing any funding for the demolition of the property located at 177 West Street due to the issues causing the imminent emergency being structural in nature and not environmental. As such, they have deemed the demolition to fall outside the scope of their oversight. We have been informed that even if the building does contain hazardous materials, since there is no current evidence of any hazardous spills leaking outside the four walls of the structure that they will not be involved.

They have informed us that the demolition must be funded solely by the City and that after demolition is completed, if the City requests, the EPA may come out at that time to do a study of the area, however, that would have to be done separate of any demolition.

As such, I am re-submitting the request for appropriation for the demolition of the building, so that the building can be demolished to mitigate the potential public safety concern of the potential collapse of the structure onto the street or surrounding buildings.
