Public Hearings

The Gardner Conservation Commission resumed the joint Public Hearing under MGL, Ch. 131, § 40, Wetlands Protection Act and the City of Gardner Wetlands Protection Ordinance (City Code Ch. 650) on the Notice of Intent filed by Nelson DeMoraes, Jr., representing National Lumber, 95 Pearson Blvd. for work at National Lumber, 95 Pearson Blvd. The work will consist of the construction of a canopy and open-building addition to be attached to the north side of the existing structure for the purpose of housing a proposed sawmill. The work will occur within the 200-foot Riverfront Area of Foster Brook but outside of the 100-foot inner-riparian zone and the 100-foot buffer zone of the Bank of Foster Brook. The project is proposed as redevelopment within the Riverfront Area.

6:30 David Nash, National Lumber, Operations, presented information related to a dumpster for soil storage, a containment system for groundwater, erosion controls.

Chairman Dumas noted that the plans would need to be revised and stamped as a condition of the Order of Conditions and that details erosion control specifications would need to be included. He also commented that the plan should show a paved apron around and abutting the new structure, documentation that the existing catch basin receives the runoff from the work area, soil and snow storage areas, and a copy of the invasive plant Vegetation Management Plan or proposal.

• Earth Day and Arbor Day Events

• Mass Keystone Cooperators Program Invitation

The Agent has been selected and invited to attend the Mass Keystone Cooperators program at Harvard Forest sponsored by UMass Extension. The program focuses on developing and connecting community leaders in the interest of promoting sustainable forestry and land protection in Massachusetts.

Old Business

Kendall Pond Betterment Association Beaver Concerns:

The Commission advised the KPBA to seek the approval of the Board of Health to determine if the water level created by the existing beaver dam at the outfall of Kendall Pond warranted breaching of the dam. The KPBA will also seek the assistance of MassDOT to clear the culvert under West Broadway (Route 2A) at the outfall of Kendall Pond so that the situation is not exacerbated. John Cestone, KPBA will keep the Agent informed of the outcome and notify him of the date and time when the culvert may be cleaned by MassDOT so that he can be present during the work. Beaver trapping will continue until the end of the trapping season on April 15th.
